

ECBU GRADUATION RATE 2019-2022



Essential Features of the ECBU Major

• EBCU prepares cadets for the demands of today's modern career world.

- We expect cadets to graduate in 4 years.
- Cadets take 17 to 17.5 hours per semester.
- Our program requires 66 credit hours in economics and business and 139 credit hours overall.
- We provide challenging quantitative coursework that increases in rigor each year.



Our program is grounded in a liberal arts education:

- The "rat" year consists of General Education courses.
- Cadets must complete two years (i.e., 4 courses) of the same foreign language.
- Cadets select 9 hours of electives in humanities and social sciences.


