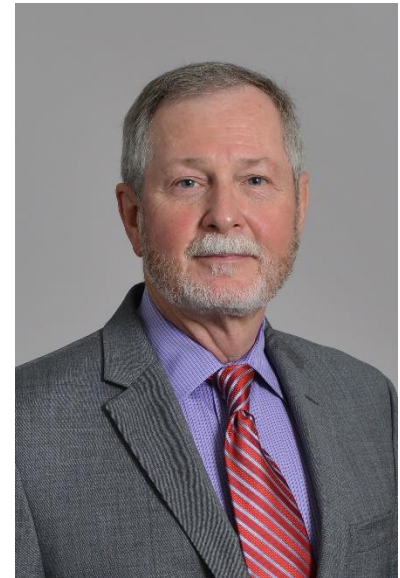

### **Background**

His most recent executive position was as the Chief Technology Officer for a 90,000 person, international organization, and he is currently engaged in private sector technology transformation consulting and facilitation with multiple companies.

Stephen holds the Doctor of Philosophy degree in Strategic Management from the Adam Smith School of Business, University of Glasgow, Scotland UK. He earned graduate degrees in the Management of Information Technology from University of Virginia, and in Public Administration from Virginia Tech, as well as the Bachelor of Political Science from James Madison University.
